Help a Veteran

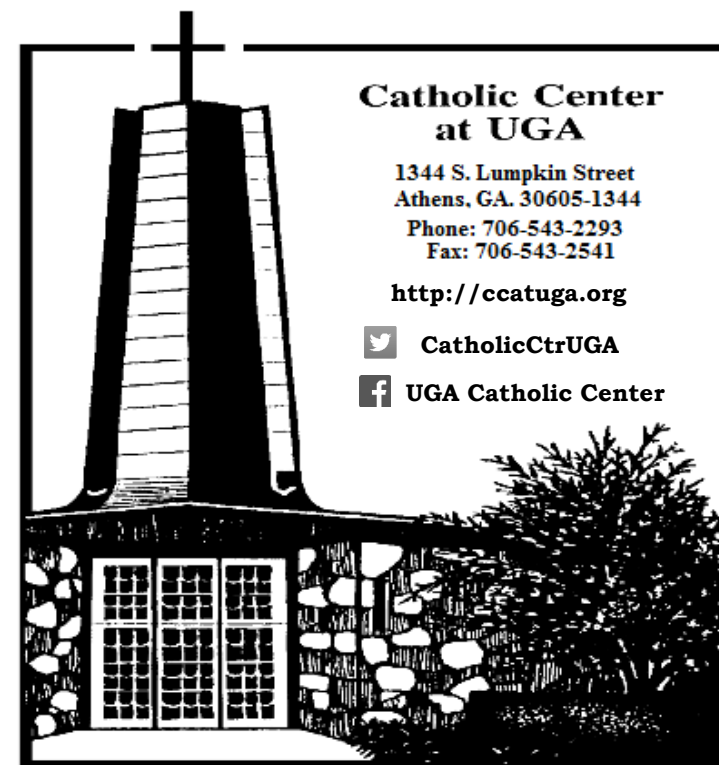
