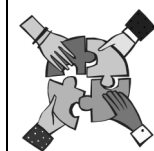
**ANNUAL DENNY TOWERS THANKSGIVING DINNER**

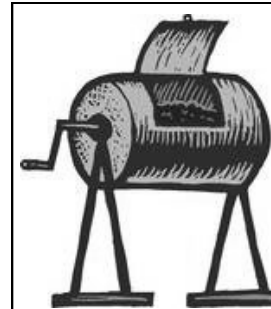
