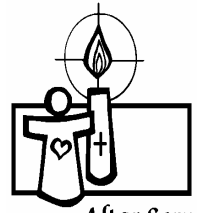

LOVE NEVER FAILS

The Catholic Center needs every member's participation to make our goal of \$50,000 for 2016.
