STUDENT OUTREACH

One important aspect of our outreach to the students of UGA focuses on our alternative spring breaks.

"One of my fondest memories from my trip to Cuba was getting to know the wonderful friars we stayed with in Havana. Most of them could not speak any English, and most of us on the trip could not speak much Spanish. However, after spending a week together, we built some amazing, heartfelt friendships. In fact, we still message with the friars even today. On one of our last nights together, we all went out for ice cream in the city. Two of the friars brought along their guitars, and before we knew it, we were singing and dancing in a grassy area in the middle of the streets in Havana. The friars taught us some of their favorite Spanish songs and dances, and we, in turn, taught them some of ours. It was a night full of faith, love, and laughter, and yet we could barely speak 10 words in the same language." - Kimberly Stier (Cuba 2017)

ARCHBISHOP GREGORY ON TPS

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) has long advocated for the reform of our nation's immigration system. The discussions these days about immigration are often difficult, but the Church continues to remind us that when we speak about immigrants, we are speaking about children of God, made in His image, and also, our brothers and sisters.

There are many parts of our current immigration system that requires remediation. The Catholic Bishops have drawn attention to these and have made recommendations to our nation's political leaders accordingly. Today, I want to bring attention to one aspect of our immigration system that requires immediate attention. It is the program that offers Temporary Protected Status (TPS) to persons from nations facing particular hardships. This program was created as a generous response from the United States to suffering neighbors.

Currently, there are several hundred thousand TPS holders who are in our country legally and are authorized to work. They pay taxes, contribute to our communities, our businesses, and our parishes. Many have children who are United States citizens. Sadly, for many of them, as our Bishops' Conference reminds us, conditions are such that "they cannot return safely to their home country at this time." To add to this, the TPS programs for these countries are about to expire. A report from the USCCB expresses concern for persons from Honduras and El Salvador, and urges extension of the TPS program. The Bishops' Conference is also completing an onsite visit to Haiti, which still suffers the effects of a catastrophic earthquake. Our Conference is forwarding these reports to our government officials. We believe that conditions in Haiti are not favorable at this time, and again urge the extension of this program.

I want to add my voice to that of my brother Catholic Bishops in urging President Trump and our Department of Homeland Security to take measures to extend TPS for these countries for another 18 months. I urge the President and Congress to find a more permanent solution for those hundreds of thousands of TPS holders, who are raising their families here and who have become productive members of our communities.


