Archbishop Gomez, from Los Angeles, in his homily stated, "The whole Christian religion comes down to one truth. We believe in a personal God who wants to share his life with us, a God who comes in search of us, who calls us to seek him and comes to help us find him. The whole Christian religion comes down to one truth. We believe in a personal God who wants to share his life with us, a God who comes in search of us, who calls us to seek him and comes to help us find him." (March 1, 2017)

My dear friends, as we celebrate this Feast of the Epiphany we need to take stock of our lives in how we embraced this plan of God. I believe there is within each one of us a fundamental choice, either to live the plan of God, the life of a Christian, or to choose the way of the world. Ask ourselves: Are we living as the Body of Christ here on earth? Are we growing stagnant and complacent-not growing in holiness, in compassion, in mercy and justice? Do we build encounters with strangers or are we fearful? Do we reach out in love to the poor and those on the margins? Do we tear down walls of prejudice, swallow our pride and seek reconciliation, offer a hand of compassion to the broken? Are we willing to become vulnerable, is humility a virtue within our lives? Or will we build walls, become hard of heart, surround our homes with barbed wire and close our minds so that we can no longer even speak civilly with someone with a different point of view?

We live in a time where civil discourse is waning, and the voices of division, hate and indifference are gaining momentum. Very few listen anymore and fewer are open to dialogue in understanding the other, whether a group or an individual. Where do we find common ground? The bridge, the common ground God has created for us is found in the Maji, in the story of these travelers. Through following their hearts and not the words of the powerful, who are only concerned with their own place and interest and not the ones they are called to serve, these Maji give us hope that in following the light, the divisions and the equalities that exist can be bridged. We need to listen to our dreams and build and make a reality the dreams of others. We need to come together as brothers and sisters whatever our beliefs, our culture, our race, our religion, our political leanings. We need to come together because of our basic humanity. We are all one. We need to follow the stars in our lives that give us light and give us hope. We no longer need to live hopeless, alienated, or angry lives. Jesus is the bridge - he has shown us the way to live, the way that leads to the fullness of joy and life with God. Many have crossed that bridge but many have not out of fear. May our journey to see the Christ child and do homage give us hope, give us peace as we share our gifts and recognize the giftedness and the wonder given to us by God's grace.
