LABOR DAY REFLECTION

"I would like to remind everyone, especially governments engaged in boosting the world's economic and social assets, that the primary capital to be safeguarded and valued is man, the human person in his or her integrity: 'Man is the source, the focus and the aim of all economic and social life." These words, inspired by the Second Vatican Council and promulgated by Pope Benedict XVI, offer the foundation for what we celebrate each year on Labor Day: the *human beings* who offer their lives in work.

Nothing in the economy matters if those laboring do not benefit from it.

Laborers should be fulfilled by their work and given just wages. If this does not happen, they should empowered to defend their natural right to provide for their families through safe, humanizing jobs.

Too often, however, human labor is exploited for the economic benefit of a few. Seen as nothing more than a figure on the bottom line, human life is degraded in the workplace with inadequate wages, unsafe conditions, withheld benefits, and negated freedoms. Worst of all, we live in a world with more forced labor than at any point in human history. Last year, the Global Slavery Index estimated that there were more than 400,000 people living in modern day slavery... in the United States alone.

For Catholics, Labor Day is a time to be proud of the fruit of our own labors, but also a time to remember that not everyone enjoys justice in our world. This year, as we enjoy our time away from work, remember those who labor without benefit or satisfaction, and allow yourself to be unsettled by what still needs to be changed in our world.

INTRODUCING CATHOLIC QUESTIONS

What does the priest wear at mass and other sacraments?

At mass and celebrating the other sacraments, the priest wears special garments that are unfamiliar to our everyday life. Finding their origin in the ancient days of the Church, each article has a particular purpose and symbolic meaning.

Alb (white garment): symbolizing the purity of one's baptism, this vestment may be worn by anyone in the Church, including acolytes, choir members, and even lectors. In wearing this, the priest highlights his common vocation with all of the faithful.

Stole (narrow cloth around neck): originally fashioned to resemble an animal yoke, this vestment symbolizes the weight that Jesus carried upon himself, and is reserved to ordained offices. Only a bishop, priest, or deacon may wear a stole, and it the most important vestment for any of the sacraments.

Chasuble (decorative outer garment): worn by the principle celebrant, this vestment, which derives from the Latin word "house," was worn as a means of protection from the elements, as it completely covered the celebrant. Symbolically, it represents the charity of Christ who covered a multitude of sins.

Cope (long cloak/mantle): when a celebration takes place outside of mass (baptism, matrimony, Benediction, consecrations, processions, etc.) this vestment may replace the chasuble, although it is generally optional.
