This year, we as a Franciscan family celebrate the power of dialogue. Eight hundred years ago, in the midst of the Crusades, St. Francis of Assisi and his companion, Illuminatus, set out to meet the Muslim Sultan of Palestine. Svria. and Egypt, Sultan al-Malik al-K'mall. He was a devout Muslim could have had St Francis of Assisi killed for trying to convert him. The Sultan spared the life of St Francis. It is not exactly known what Francis and the Sultan al-Malik al-K'mall discussed, but historians say Francis returned home a changed man and impressed about his experience with the Sultan and the feeling and experience was mutual. It is only through encounter are we able to break down the barriers to peace, unity and respect by addressing the divisiveness of fear, hatred, ignorance and complacency. CATHOLIC QUESTIONS

Why do the Franciscan use a different cross?



Here at the center and around the world, Franciscan parishes use a distinct version of the crucifix. While not painted by St. Francis or any of followers, it is deeply connected to the Franciscan movement. What is this cross, and why is it significant

Called the "San Damiano cross," its painter is unknown the Romanesque rood cross was likely constructed arou 1100 in Umbria, Italy. Unlike other crucifixes, Jesus is than just a dead corpse, but is portrayed alive and glori eyes open to gaze on the congregation. Another differe between this one and others is that he is not alone: depi alongside Jesus are angels and saints, mourners and observers, and even two animals. More than just the crucifixion, the cross encapsulates many scenes of Chr passion.

The reason that Franciscans use this cross is because it the one that inspired St. Francis' conversion. Found in abandoned chapel outside of Assisi, the seraphic saint prayed before it, hearing Christ speak to him "rebuild n church." It was here, one could say, that the Franciscan movement was born. Today, the cross hangs in the Bas of St. Clare in Assisi.
