# **CATHOLIC QUESTIONS**

#### Who can receive Anointing of the sick?

Among the most powerful—and most misunderstood sacraments of the Church is Anointing of the Sick. Often associated with death and called "last rites" or "extreme unction" many believe that it can only be administered in one's final moments of life. This is simply not true. Anyone facing grave illness or serious harm may receive the sacrament for spiritual benefit, and it is commonly administered before major surgery or in the midst of ongoing non-terminal illnesses.

When the sacrament is administered at the end of one's life, and rightly called "Last Rites," it is ideally celebrated long enough before the final moment of death so that the recipient may experience the fullness of God's grace before departing from this world. In such cases, Anointing is preceded by the sacrament of confession and followed by Viaticum (Holy Communion, literally as "provision for a journey.")
