#### ADVENT REFLECTION

We think of "waiting" as wasted time: prevented from moving while we wait for someone else to act. But the season of Advent calls us to more "creative" waiting: envisioning what is to come and making it possible for that vision to be realized. Waiting become, to realize, to complete, to restore is part of the human experience — and though such waiting can be agonizing, frustrating, and terrifying, Advent is about waiting in



hope and anticipating the good that is possible.

We celebrate the birth of God's Christ in the darkest days of the year. But the dawning of the light of Christ enables us not only to not fear the darkness but to find God in the darkness. The season of Advent calls us to such "pregnant waiting": not passive, disengaged waiting, but a waiting that anticipates and makes possible now for what is to come. The experience of waiting enables us to realize what we appreciate, value and cherish; waiting teaches us how to be present and attentive to family and friends; waiting opens our vision and spirits to realize the love of God in our midst.

My dear friends, may we see past the words, the fears, the walls, the rhetoric, the anger and the division surrounding us that does not give birth to God. In this season of hope may we live with longing hearts for the one who brings peace, love, justice and compassion into our families, community, church and world.

### **CATHOLIC QUESTIONS**

#### **How Does Advent Work?**

Everyone knows that Advent is a time of preparation and waiting for Christmas. What you may not know is that each week's readings have a particular theme to help us prepare.

The first Sunday of Advent looks to the "End Times" and the coming of the "Day of the Lord." The readings remind us that Jesus Christ has already been born, and what we *truly* await is not the birth of a child but the eternal kingdom of God.

The second Sunday always focuses on the preaching and ministry of John the Baptist as a forerunner of Jesus. We are to take his words to heart and as we convert our own way of life.

The third Sunday, called "Gaudete Sunday," conveys the joy that we feel with the increasing closeness of the solemnity of Christmas. While the Gloria is still not sung, the mass on this date is the most festive of the Sundays.

Finally, the fourth Sunday recalls the events that immediately preceded the birth of Christ. This year the focus is on Joseph, but years B and C focus on Mary.
