LET GO: Seven Stumbling Blocks to Christian Discipleship

"What must I do to gain eternal life?" The rich man who asked this of Jesus was told to sell all he had and give to the poor, but he went away sad because he had many possessions. While we often interpret this story to be about money or good stewardship, I don't believe that this is the essential point being made. No, more fundamentally, it is about discipleship. The fact that the rich man was unwilling to give up his money proves Jesus' insistence that he give it up—not because there is something inherently wrong with money, but because it got in the way of following him. When we look at the things that hold us back from being true disciples, sin is obviously a major factor, but it is not always the biggest stumbling block. Sometimes, it is the


completely ordinary that holds us back. In Let Go: Seven Stumbling Blocks to

Christian Discipleship, I challenge Christians to let go of their false expectations, anxiety, comfort, wounds, enemies, power -and even our very selves.

CATHOLIC QUESTIONS

What's the difference between Franciscans, Jesuits, Dominicans, etc.?

While there is a difference between diocesan priests and religious priests (as was explained in a previous post) there are also differences among the religious priests. These differences are based on what is call a "charism."

Much like the word "charisma," the word charism finds its root in the Greek word for grace or gift. In a religious sense, a charism it represents a special character within a person to share a truth about God. Someone can have a charism for speaking, healing, teaching, caring for the poor, and so on. Each religious order has a central gift of its founder that guides the way it lives today.

In general terms, the charisms of the major orders are study and preaching (Dominicans), work and prayer (Benedictines), justice and discernment (Jesuits), contemplation and community (Carmelites), and humility and brotherhood (Franciscans).
