CATHOLIC QUESTIONS

Do Catholics still fast before communion?

For many years, the Catholic Church had a very strict fast prior to receiving communion, requiring communicants to abstain from food, water, and even medicine from midnight the night before mass. Not much is talked about this anymore. Is there still a rule? The rules for fasting were updated three times in the 20th century, with the final one coming in 1964 from St. Pope Paul VI. The current rules, as stated in canon 919 of canon law, are as follows:

- §1. A person who is to receive the Most Holy Eucharist is to abstain for at least one hour before holy communion from any food and drink, except for only water and medicine.
- §3. The elderly, the infirm, and those who care for them can receive the Most Holy Eucharist even if they have eaten something within the preceding hour.

So, yes, there is still a rule for fasting. We would not stop at a fast food restaurant on the way to an expensive banquet, and so we do not fill our physical bodies with food prior to going to the heavenly banquet of the Eucharist. It reminds us that we do not live on bread alone, but require spiritual nourishment from heaven.
