REFLECTION FROM FATHER FRANK

The Scrutinies within our liturgies over these next three weeks are rites of conversion and repentance at liturgies where the Elect are present. The Elect are those who are preparing for Baptism. Part of their journey to the font is that they have been received among us, the Rite of Acceptance, and they have been enrolled in the Book of the Elect in the Rite of Election which was celebrated two weeks ago with Bishop Ned. These are ancient rites and they may, at first, seem strange to us. But they are profoundly rooted in our human experience. We need to examine (scrutinize) how we are, the areas of our lives where we are tempted, or seriously sin - in what we do and what we fail to do. We really need healing and the strength that can come from the support of our sisters and brothers. As Easter approaches, we prepare to welcome these participants in Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) through the Sacraments of Initiation. RCIA is not only for those seeking full initiation into the Church. RCIA involves the whole Christian community. RCIA is for two groups of people: the unbaptized and baptized Christians seeking full communion with the Church. For the unbaptized (catechumen), RCIA prepares them to receive all three Sacraments of Initiation—Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. Baptized Christians (candidates) and Catholics will receive Confirmation and/or the Eucharist. Even if these rites are not celebrated at the liturgy we attend, it can be wonderful to reflect upon the journey these Elect are making during Lent, as an inspiration and source of renewal for us in our journey. Let us pray for these, our brothers and sisters, as they prepare to enter fully into our community. May their presence at our liturgies inspire all of us on our journey to a deeper awareness of God's presence in our lives and where we are all called to live out our baptismal commitment every day of our lives.


SUMMER BIBLE CAMP

CATHOLIC QUESTIONS

Communion only under one kind?

With the recent spread of COVID-19 and the danger of the flu, the Archdiocese has decided to withhold the chalice from the congregation as an attempt to prevent further infections. For some, this has raised a theological question: how can the Church do this and maintain the validity of the liturgy? Two things.



One is right to question the diminished sign value of the Eucharist. Jesus implemented a meal, and we experience that fullness of that meal when we take part in everything he did, receiving the body and blood. For this reason, it is required that a Mass include the precious blood, if for no one else than the priest. The sacrifice must be offered, and under normal circumstances, it is encouraged for the faithful in the United States to take part fully.

That being said, the Church has long taught the theology of "concomitance," the doctrine that the fullness of Christ's body, blood, soul, and divinity are equally present in the Eucharistic bread and wine. A person can receive one without the other. It lacks the fullness of the sign, yes, but is not lacking in the efficacious grace that it bestows.
