Dear Catholic Community at UGA:

At the present time I'm reading a little book called "Finding Christ in the Crisis: What the Pandemic can teach us". I quote the opening of this little book: "The COVID -19 pandemic has been hard on all of us. As Catholics, we suffered real loss with the closure of churches in the spring of 2020 and the ongoing restrictions on celebration of the sacraments. As time has worn on, the spiritual desert we have collectively experienced and the challenge of finding new ways to keep the Lord's Day have been difficult and painful. We struggle to make sense of the global crisis, and even of decisions made by Church leaders to protect our health and well-being. People's reactions to church closures and reopening's have covered a whole spectrum, from gratitude to anger and frustration. The Church is always called to read the 'signs of the times' in light of our faith. So, in the midst of everything we face with this pandemic, we need to ask: Is God speaking right now? How do we hear see God in this moment? How we do listen for his voice?"
