

# The Catholic Center

The Gospel today comes from the third chapter of the Gospel of John. Jesus encounters a religious leader named Nicodemus who is very curious about Jesus. He sneaks away at nighttime so that he can speak with Jesus.

Perhaps Nicodemus goes at night because he doesn't want others to find out. Nicodemus is curious and has heard Jesus speak profound words. He has the desire to follow this person Jesus... his heart is beginning to be on fire.

Nicodemus is usually the one who teaches others about God. He grew up in a religious family, studied the scriptures, performed the sacred rituals, preached to the community... and yet here he is wanting to learn from Jesus.

It's almost as if everything he has known to be true is suspended in the air. He is captivated and goes to Jesus at night to listen to his words. Jesus talks with him. They have a conversation. He instructs him about how God is on a mission to offer everyone everlasting life. Jesus communicates to Nicodemus that God wants every single person to experience true life. It is from a heart of love that this desire flows.

Nicodemus listens to it all. He learns from Jesus and probably takes it with him to ponder in his home. The words of Jesus resonate within him, ringing true. This scene isn't the last time we hear from Nicodemus as he shows up later in the Gospel. Nicodemus appears - not at night - but now during the day, right after Jesus was crucified. Nicodemus shows up in order to bury him. He's no longer afraid to be seen with Jesus. He brings a gift of myrrh and buries the body of Jesus with dignity.

This Lenten season we have an opportunity to be like Nicodemus. Perhaps we've been brought up in a religious family, knowing all the scripture passages, having gone through the traditional rituals and even served as a leader in this community. Nicodemus encourages us to show up, listen and have the words of Jesus take root in our hearts.
