MAJOR PLUMBING PROJECT

March 22-24, 2021

Next week we will be replacing the old sewer pipes from the Center and Chapel to the septic lines. Our existing pipes are failing thus causing multiple plumbing issues at the Center. The sewer pipes will be replaced beginning Monday, March 22 to Wednesday, March 24.



Please note the changes below:

- *There will be no bathroom facilities/water at the Chapel or Center. We will have 2 port-a-pots on the property but no running water.
- *The Catholic Center office will be closed Monday 3/22-Wednesday 3/24.
- *The parking lot exit onto Lumpkin St. will be closed from the street to the Center from 3/22-3/24. Only staff will be able to enter and exit through the Lumpkin St. entrance.
- * All students who park at the Catholic Center must enter and exit the parking lot from the Cloverhurst entrance. Students attending Mass, Adoration Seeking Water and Ignite are asked to park behind the Center. We will not be enforcing the parking permits during these days.
- * The Penance Service will take place at 7:00PM on Monday 3/22 (no 5:30 Mass on Monday). There will be 5:30PM Mass on Tuesday and Wednesday. There will be NO parking in front of the Center or around the Chapel. You may park behind the Center. You may also park at the Global Engagement Building (formerly the International Education Building) next to the Catholic Center after 5:00PM.
