## A Message from Sr. Catherine

Hello Catholic Community at UGA,

Blessings on this 26th Sunday of Ordinary Time! I have been so touched to see many people walk through the front door of the Catholic Center over the last week with their arms full of tea and spices, toiletries and food for the welcome baskets that will soon be distributed to families arriving as refugees from Afghanistan. Each gesture seems to me to be a reflection of God's own heart which embraces, comforts and walks with each of us, and in a particular way with those who are undergoing times of trial and vulnerability. These acts of solidarity and compassion are a beautiful proclamation of the Gospel of Christ, who stepped into the breach of human suffering and need by his incarnation and continues to do so today.

I find Jesus' words in today's Gospel fascinating, challenging and ultimately heartening. When John tells him that the disciples have tried to stop someone who was performing miracles in Jesus' name, Jesus tells him that is mistaken. He's not part of our group, our band, our tribe, so he must be dangerous to the truth and to us, is John's way of reading the situation. Jesus takes a different tact, however. If he is not against us, he is for us, is his response. Jesus' vision is capable of perceiving goodness and possibility in the work of others who are different. He seems to feel less need to control every expression of faith and charity and to trust in the way that God's Spirit moves in the hearts of men and women of good will, urging them on to collaborate in the more like Jesus does (and, to his later point, to recognize and release what blinds me) so that, rather than becoming a stumbling block for others who seek to do God's will, I might be a wholehearted collaborator in God's plan of salvation... that plan which is sure, embraces all of creation, and which even today unfolds in myriad and mysterious ways.
