April 10, 2022 • Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord

A Message From Fr. Brian

Dear Catholic Center Community,

We begin Holy Week with Palm Sunday, also known as Passion Sunday. We begin this most sacred week with the entrance of Jesus into Jerusalem, heralded with palms and high praises. The reflection continues with the focus on the passion and death of Jesus. We will read the entire passion narrative at our Sunday Celebration.

On Tuesday at the Cathedral in Atlanta, all the priests gather with the bishops for our annual Chrism Mass, a liturgy when the sacred oils are blessed by the bishop. The oils are processed down the aisle and the bishop receives them, prays over them, and stirs the perfume into the chrism. The Oil of the Sick is pure olive oil and is commissioned for the sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. The Oil of Catechumens is also pure olive oil and is the first Anointing used during a baptism. The Chrism oil is olive oil mixed with balsam. It is used as the second Anointing during baptism and also during confirmations, ordinations, consecration of bishops, dedication of churches, and blessing of altars. At this annual chrism mass, the priests renew their promises that they took at ordination.

Holy Thursday we reflect on the Last Supper. Jesus washes the disciples feet and institutes the Sacred Eucharist. As Catholics, we look towards this scene as the Institution of the Eucharist and also the Institution. of Priesthood. Jesus shows his disciples how to serve by bending down and washing feet. We reenact this washing of the feet as a community because Jesus teaches us that this is the way to be Christians, by giving of oneself and serving the other. We then gather around the altar together to remember the Last Supper. While we do this every time we gather for mass, there is a special remembrance as we intentionally reflect on the gift of Jesus' Body and Blood for all of history.

Good Friday is a time to intentionally reflect on the Cross of Christ. We gather for this solemn celebration in silence. The Church venerates the cross after the homily by walking up and praying in front of it. We then gather around the altar of calvary and remember the death of Christ. We leave in silence and strip the church of decorations.

Easter Vigil on Saturday night is the time when we bring new people into the Catholic Church. They have been preparing for baptism and confirmation this past year and are officially brought into the fullness of the faith. The Easter Vigil celebration, which is usually 3 hours long, begins with a bonfire in the front of the church. We say some prayers over the fire, light our new Easter Candle, and process into the Church proclaiming the Light of Christ. Christ has Risen from the Tomb. We read more readings than usual at this mass because we go through salvation history, or the macro story of the Bible, God at work with His people. We baptize, confirm, and give first communion to those who have been preparing to enter into the Catholic Church fully. This year, we have about 4 people being baptized and 8 people coming into the Catholic Church from another denomination. These are a mix of college students and permanent residents of Athens. Let us keep each other in prayer as we enter into Holy Week! I Invite you to enter into the spiritual depths of this week with personal prayer and attendance of these liturgies!
