A Message from Sr. Uyen-Chi

Dear Catholic Community at UGA,

Happy Easter to you and your family! "This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad" (Psalm 118). What makes this day so joyous for us who believe that Christ is Risen? The Easter Triduum - from the evening of Holy Thursday to the evening of Easter Sunday - is the summit of the Liturgical Year, unfolding for us the unity of Christ's suffering, dying, and rising. We truly cannot experience the joy of Easter without the sadness of Good Friday. We cannot experience life if there is no death.

One of the most moving moments, for me, in the Passion of our Lord is when Scripture speaks about "a lance pierced into the side of Jesus and immediately water and blood flowed out" (John 19:34). In my recent retreat, I meditated and pondered this verse and was moved to put it into drawing what Christ's suffering, dying, and rising mean for me. I saw myself along with humanity as recipients of Jesus' outpouring love. This healing love flows abundantly into our broken vessels, and enters specifically where the crack and brokenness occur, so that "in him we have



redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of sins" (Ephesian 1:7) and "by his wounds [we] are healed" (1 Peter 2:24). By his resurrection Christ conquered death, broke the chains that bind us, and restored us to fullness of life in God. Often, it is precisely the place of pain and death that God shows his mercy and love most clearly. At the Easter Vigil when the Exsultet is sung, we hear the words: "O happy fault, O necessary sin of Adam, which gained for us so great a Redeemer!" Therefore, Easter makes it possible to begin anew because God can awaken in us new life, precisely where once there was pain and suffering. God can bring about life where death and darkness once reigned. This is the joy of Easter for me! May each one of us experience the joy that is uniquely ours this Easter. Let us together exclaim, "My heart exults in God, the joy of my salvation."

A Reflection from A Student

When I think of Easter, I often think of Good Friday, as well. To me, the idea that ties those two days together is death. But what I find beautiful is how much that idea of death changed in just a few short days.

On Good Friday, death held the cards. Dying was a guarantee for all of us. Eternal life wasn't in our grasp. Death was the wage of sin, and we were all sinners. We died, and that was it.

And then death dealt another blow. Jesus, the Savior, the Prophet, the Son of God, died. Not only did He die, but He was horrifically murdered. If that can happen to Him, what chance do the rest of us stand?

On Good Friday, it seemed death had won.

Fast forward, though, and the unimaginable happens. Jesus is risen. The shackles of death are broken. The gates of Heaven are open. Death is no longer a prison to be feared; eternal life is within our grasp! Instead of being shadowed in darkness, the world is lit with hope. Death is defeated and Christ is alive.

I used to be afraid of death. I don't think that's anything to be ashamed of; even Jesus was scared. But, over time, I have begun to overcome this fear. How? By holding onto the knowledge of what's next, that there even is a next. Death is the doorway to eternal life.

Right before Jesus died, He said "Into your hand I commend my spirit". Now, He sits at God's right hand. Imagine what awaits us, both in this life and the next, if we give ourselves to God. Instead of running from the inevitability of death, run towards the path God is calling you to. Use this Easter as a reminder that the Lord takes even the scariest and ugliest things, like death, and makes them good. In a few days, God can totally change the world; imagine how much He can do in your life.
