Did you know that Sacred Music is the highest form of Sacred Art in the Church?

That's right. The Catechism of the Catholic Church states: "The musical tradition of the universal Church is a treasure of inestimable value, greater even than that of any other art." (CCC, #1156)

Therefore, great care must be taken to bring forth sacred music that is liturgically sound and a vessel to bring the faithful into deeper worship. So how can we do this? Pope Saint Pius X explains in his document "Tra le Sollecitudini" (Instruction on Sacred Music) that for Sacred Music to be just that...sacred...it must embody three principles: holiness, excellence of form (true art), and universality.

For music to be holy, it must lead the congregation to a more profound sense of worship. It also mustn't be distracting in both genres, words, and execution. We would never play "Hotel California" in mass or Wagners' Symphony #1...while both are two very different genres, they do not lend themselves to being holy.

Music also has to have a quality of true art. This means that the music being played, written, and led, has been brought about for the sole purpose of the liturgy. No other outside influences that can cause distraction should be used.

Finally, sacred music in the liturgy needs to be universal. The Church has two definitions for this. One, the Church takes into consideration the culture. Let's be clear, while the Church is in the world, it is not of the world and therefore can take what the world has and use it to enhance the liturgy, but it can not bow to the culture in reforms to the liturgy and music.

Universal also means that regardless of the vernacular or genre, we as a community of believers know that the music being played is, in fact, sacred. Whether the music is chant, on the organ, or played on a guitar. It all must lend itself to being universally sacred.
