A Message from Fr. Michael

Dear Catholic Center Community,

All that you see here, the days will come when there will not be left a stone upon another stone that will not be thrown down. -Luke 21

Temple, from the Latin "Templum," means a place of observation. In the temple, I observe the Reality that created reality: in the temple, I observe God. But in today's Gospel, Jesus gives the ominous prophecy that the Temple will not be left standing; furthermore, He give the prophecy about people pretending to come back as Himself, wars, insurrections, earthquakes, famines, plaques, being seized and persecuted, etc.

When I pay attention to how my heart reacts when I observe the world, there can be many things swirling around. What Jesus is trying to draw my attention to are *His* observations. As it were, the invitation is to observe God observing the world. From this point, I don't simply template – trying to draw rash and reductionary conclusions on my own – I *con*-template, I observe *with* someone: in this case, God. When I observe the world and the reaction in my heart, I recognize I need someone else with whom to observe these things.

When I see God observe me, when I see God observe the world, it's in His Gaze that I begin to find hope: He knows everything, to Him everything is figured out. The invitation is to see God seeing me. When prayer begins to be this simple, I may see things falling apart around me, but I turn my attention and at least I observe I'm not alone: in this inner temple, God reveals to me what will never fall apart: the relationship between God and myself.
