A Message from UGA Student Nolan

Dear Catholic Center Community,

During winter break, over sixty UGA students traveled to St. Louis, Missouri for the SEEK Conference. Hosted by FOCUS, the Fellowship of Catholic University Students, the goal of this week-long conference was to allow attendees to dive "into the heart of the gospel" and explore "how to answer Christ's call in every moment". Over 17,000 people attended the conference- half of those being college students.

The attendees had the opportunity to grow in faith, fellowship, and community through a variety of activities and events offered. Daily keynote sessions were presented on the topics of the cross, the passion of Christ, and faith. Catholic speakers, for the keynote sessions, included Fr. Mike Schmitz, Sr. Miriam James Heidland, and Dr. Edward Sri. Daily mass was offered, giving the students a unique opportunity to celebrate mass with thousands of people. Concurrent talks offered advice for specific groups of men and women, including presentations on leadership. An adoration chapel located in the conference center, which included many first and second class relics, allowed students to be with the blessed sacraments any time during the day. The remainder of the day included impact sessions, short hour-long talks on specific topics, from which students could choose. I chose to attend sessions about engaging topics, such as Reverence and Masculinity, How to Win an Argument Without Losing a Soul: Defending the Faith, and What is God Inviting You To?

One of the most unique opportunities about attending the conference was the ability to interact with those in religious life and students from other colleges that share the faith. SEEK allowed me to strike up a conversation with a seminarian after evening prayer and have lunch with students from different colleges and the Sisters of the third Order of Saint Francis. Getting to tell my story and talk to other students who live the faith was an enlightening experience. Everyone has their own story of why they are Catholic and this was evident with all the conversations between students across the country.

A single word to sum up the experience would be eye-opening. The day-to-day part of being involved in a parish or Catholic center can make you forget that there are millions of people outside your world participating in the faith. Through this conference, I was reminded that there is hope in the Catholic church, not only from those who are older in the faith, but from the next generation of Catholics who have a desire to seek the Lord.
