A Message from Sr. Catherine

But the gift is not like the transgression. For if by the transgression of the one, the many died, how much more did the grace of God and the gracious gift of the one man Jesus Christ overflow for the many.

Dear Friends.

As we step into Lent, time of preparation for our highest feast, these lines offer firm hope. Despite all the signs of sin and sorrow that we see in our world and often enough in our own lives, God's grace is more abundant. The game is rigged, as it were, in favor of grace, and believing this, we can strive with hope to embrace it, grow in it, and bear it forth. I imagine that it was this deep-rooted knowing that sustained Jesus in the desert as he endured hunger, thirst and temptation in preparation for his public ministry for and among "the many." He sends the wily tempter packing because he knows that he will be sustained by the one who is Love and who fulfills all promises in truth.

Grace is the love of the Trinity that God pours forth upon creation. Without it we would not be sad and sorrowful, we simply would *not be*. It is the foundation of existence. Grace calls us into being and draws us into God's own life and love. If we wonder what this looks like, just think of a time you were conscious of offering or receiving disinterested, generous, joyful love. That's participation in the love of the Trinity. We look also to the Gospels and watch how Jesus moves in the world- Life and Love on brilliant display.

The reason we fast during this season is not to satisfy God, it is to remember and come to know more deeply our reliance on God. Whatever our Lenten practices this year, may they help us to become more free of that which crowds the space into which God desires to pour his grace; more free to claim our joyful heritage as daughters and sons of our good and merciful God; more free to recognize both our need and the amazing gift that is given and that we commemorate during Holy Week and Eastertime. We can be sure that when we open space and ask humbly, expectantly for God's gift, we will be filled.
