Dear Catholic Center Community,

Some people don't like to make promises because they are afraid they will fail to keep them. Others make them readily and forget or fizzle out. This reality is reflected in everything from the parables of Jesus ("Go out and work in the vineyard today,"... "I will not"... but he changed his mind and went... "Yes, Sir"... but he did not go... Mt 21:28-30) to the pop music of, say, Justin Bieber ("Don't like making promises... just remember this...I will love you different"). We can probably all identify a moment or a situation in which we were faced with this tension in our own lives- between committing or not, between a realistic understanding of human fickleness and the deep desire for "Yes" to mean "Yes" and "No" to mean "No", for the long haul, at all costs.

If we look at the trajectory of the love story between God and Israel that populates the Old Testament, we see both fidelity and forgetfulness. The people forget and God remembers and keeps at it, refusing to renege on love. As Paul reminds us, regardless of our response, "God remains faithful" (faithful to the truth, faithful to love, faithful to the good...), "for He cannot deny himself" (2Tim 2:13) It is God's unwavering fidelity, expression of God's very nature, that can and should move us to dare to make and keep promises rooted in love, despite the fact that our knees may sometimes tremble. The one who co-signs on our "Yes" remains close and draws on an infinite supply of grace which He shares freely.

In Jesus, we see what this divine integrity looks like in human form, and His life becomes for us the way by which we can live into it. It is "His Spirit dwelling in (us)" (Rom 8:11) that makes us capable of holy boldness and lasting commitment that hold up even when we encounter the cross. It is His spirit that reveals the blessedness that "eye has not seen, nor ear heard" (1Cor 2:9) that awaits us on the other side of the cross. Mary and Martha exhibit faith that keeps burning even in the midst of their sorrow and disappointment. "If you had been here"... "but even now..." (Jn 11:21-22). May we, like them, bring our needs to the Lord with all openness. May we sense his nearness and he weeps and rejoices with us. May we await with hope the good that He brings, and, rooted in that hope, commit ourselves to partnering with Him in incarnating the promises of His Kingdom, especially among those who suffer most. Blessings to you!
