A Message from Fr. Michael

Dear Catholic Center Community,

This Man God raised on the third day and granted He be visible. -Acts 10:40 For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. -Col. 3:3 So Peter and the other disciple [ran] to the tomb. -Jn. 20:3

"What a year this Lent has been," is how I've described these past forty days, and in fact how I describe Lent each time. This year though, the Lord has been teaching me a specific lesson. In the desert, as I've given up a few things, and put prayer in their stead, I've gotten a deeper glimpse into a particular attitude I have.

This attitude is mostly hidden in my life. It, however, bears itself and is revealed when God promises me something: "I will do it." (Ez 37:14) "This [death] is not to end in death." (Jn 11:4) "Though your sins be like crimson, they will become white like wool." (Is 1:18) etc., as we've heard His promises throughout Lent.

What I recognize in my own heart is an attitude of compromise. Compromise is comprised of two words: 'com' meaning "with" and 'promise' meaning "promise." In and of itself, compromise, to make a promise with someone, isn't necessarily a bad thing, but what I've been aware of is "with" what have I been making a "promise"?

And if I'm honest, the compromise has not been with God. But rather, with the tombs in my life: I have an attitude making a promise with the various tombs, consented to their arbitrary arbitration. There might be a tomb that has written on the headstone "here lies a belief of being able to be forgiven" and I hear God say "I will forgive you" to me and this tomb, and I look between the tomb and God and might make a promise with the tomb, it seems more likely. And it becomes a self fulfilling prophecy. At least for this year.

Because in today's readings, I hear one person who has not compromised with his past, "your life is hidden with Christ in God," (Col. 3:3) and another who did not compromise on her past say, "I don't know where He is." (Jn 20:2) So, here I stand on Easter, being given by God a promise to New Life: one day I will die and God tells me that won't be the final word of my life because of His faithfulness to me. And even though I've compromised that, I'm consoled but curious, in fact running: there's a tombstone being etched, "here lies the inevitability of compromise of settling for less," "here lies God." When I run to that tomb, to any tomb for that matter, it's actually empty.
