Dear Catholic Center Community,

I wanted to thank everyone for their generous giving during Easter time! Our community is growing and you can probably tell by the amount of people in the pews on the weekend and during daily mass.

So many of you give back your time, your skills, your energy, and your donations to each other in this community.

Its a beautiful image of what church looks like. The ancient church in the book of Acts speaks about how the community lived and shared everything in common. I see that here.

We are nearing the end of our fiscal year at the end of June and our numbers are looking very good. We will communicate those numbers when we can. Previous numbers are available on our website. Thank you again for your gen-

There's a few needs we have in our community that I'm going to share with you in the coming months. I'll be referencing it in the bulletin.

We have a need for a new speaker system. We've had problems with this system forever. A new system costs \$60k and so before we consider that we are going to see what we can do with our current equipment. If you have any expertise or connections, please let us know.

We want to include a sound system that serves those with hearing aids. The cost of this is an additional \$15k. We are looking into this to give a better experience for our hearing impaired community members.

Something that is important to me is cleanliness and tidying up. A need that we have is new furniture for our our Catholic Center rooms. These rooms are used by our adult bible studies, our staff meetings, various ministries, and they are used by our students. The furniture we currently have gets the job done, but they've seen better days!

We have a need for an updated website. I made some changes last summer and we are looking to do another upgrade this summer. We would like for our website to me a pleasant experience and a landing page for our members.

Something exciting we are looking into is partnering with the UGA Hodgson School of Music and bringing in some musicians and singers into our weekend Mass schedule. Our Director of Music and Liturgy, Jayne Edwards, has a background in this during her college experience at Loyola in New Orleans and is pursuing this for us. We are looking towards this Fall for a partnership.

Thank you everyone for your giving your time, talent and treasure. We have a very blessed community.

## A Reflection from Sr. Catherine

Dear Catholic Center Community,

I love this Gospel, as I imagine many of you do. There is so much going on, so much meaning packed into these few verses, and an irrepressible hope that opens up on the road to and from Emmaus. It brings to mind those moments in which we glimpse something that is so true and beautiful, so much of God, that we are filled with hope and courage and gratitude and confidence in the goodness and sureness and nearness of God. The interior rooms of our hearts are swept clean of sadness and smallness and self-focus and we are empowered to love with more radicality and to bear witness to that which has renewed our spirit. There is a deep knowing that happens whose effects are widespread and lasting. If we receive these moments and allow them to unfold, gently and with trust, they can transform us and send us back out into the world with new eyes and a new heart. How are we to do this?

One significant detail stands out to me-Jesus disappears from their sight. Once the disciples have recognized him, once their hearts have been filled and made strong, he vanishes. They do not get to "keep him" in the cozy confines of their dining room. This is not a cruel trick or a tragic mistake, as if he might have remained if only they'd reacted a half-second guicker, if only they had reached out and caught his wrist before he disappeared. This "vanishing" is rather something very necessary, part of the gift. He has already promised, "I will not leave you orphans," (Jn 14:18) and assured his friends that "it is better for you that I go... I will ask the Father and he will give you (the) Advocate" (Jn 16:7; Jn 14:16). He is not walking away. Rather, he is abiding with them in a new and more intimate way, living now within them; meeting them also, in those who continue to suffer, in "the least of my brothers and sisters," (Mt 25:40). With this solid hope, he sends them out, back to Jerusalem, back to the complex, challenging world and their messy lives, back to the places where there is hunger for bread and for belonging.

There seems to be a similar dynamic at play in Jesus' encounter with Mary Magdalen outside the tomb, when he says "stop holding on to me, for I have not yet ascended to the Father... go to my brothers and tell them..." (Jn 20:17). Here too, Jesus is teaching his friends how to live with him in another way, how to "take it on the road," as it were. There is no place and no circumstance, he seems to be saying, in which I will not be present. "I am with you always, until the end of the age" (Mt 28:20). You needn't fear running out of what you most need because I am here. There is indeed nothing that can separate us from him. This news is so Good, so life-giving, that it must be shared.

And speaking of good news, please join me in praying for and rejoicing with Chase Gary as he receives the sacraments of initiation this Sunday at the 5pm mass!
