A Message from Fr. Michael

Dear Catholic Center Community,

me. -Mt 10:38

It is not so much that Christianity has actually been tried and found lacking, but rather, it has been assumed lacking and left untried. -variation of Chesterton ... and whoever does not take up his cross and follow after Me is not worthy of

"Was it worth it?" "Is it worth it?" "Will it be worth it?" A way to process and understand the goodness (or lack thereof) of our experiences comes through the standard and question of worth. I remember, in a particular way, asking this question as I was leaving UGA to go to seminary to become a priest: "is this worth it?" I enjoy exercising, but sometimes I ask, "is this worth it?"

In today's Gospel, Jesus presents a series of serious propositions. They're all an invitation to me, to live my life in a different way. Each of them,

"whoever loves father or mother more than Me"

"whoever loves son or daughter more than Me"

"whoever does not take up his cross and follow Me,"

end with the statement "...is not worthy of Me."

And they're difficult considerations - in fact, I ask, "is it worth it? Is it worth being worthy of Jesus?" An intriguing question becomes, however, "is it worth asking if something is worth it?

And so, before I even ask the question if "it's worth it" for me to consider these things from Jesus, I actually ask *Him, "Jesus, was it worth it to take up Your cross?"*Here, in this dialogue of prayer with Him, I begin to see something different about what the cross is. No longer does it become a place of restriction, fear, or difficulty - rather, in His eyes, it becomes a place of freedom: that in a place of difficulty for Him, namely my rejection of Him, He has still decided to love me.

That He could love me no matter what, no matter what condition He is placed in, or nailed on, is freedom, true unconditional love. The cross cannot define Him, so its own definition begins to change. So, in His eyes, as the cross begins to change its meaning, with Him at my side seeing Him with His own cross-on-shoulder, I begin to taste more freedom, that I might be able to love, too, whether or not it is worth it, no matter the condition.
