Created

Captured

Sin and death entered the world. Its a part of our world. It's dark. This darkness captures us. It puts us in a captivity. We are very aware of this reality both internally and externally. There is hurt, pain, suffering, betrayal, and violence in this world that God created as good.

Rescued

God who created the world went on a rescue mission into the world to free us from this captivity. YOU are the person he wants to set free. He loves everyone, everywhere and you are not excluded from his love and focus. God went to the depths of darkness to rescue YOU from the captivity of sin and darkness.

Response

As we show up for the sacraments and prayer, we are transformed by Gods grace. We are set free and we grow in this freedom. We have access to God. Our response is staying near to Christ in Word and Sacrament while going out and being the hands and feet of Christ in the world. We are a free people inviting others to freedom. We are a hopeful people inviting others to hope. We are a rescued people, inviting others to be rescued.
