A Message from Eli Banzon

Dear Catholic Center Community,

"The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. Amen, amen, I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat; but if it dies, it produces much fruit. Whoever loves his life loses it, and whoever hates his life in this world will preserve it for eternal life. Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there also will my servant be. The Father will honor whoever serves me." Jn. 12:23-26

In order for a grain of wheat to grow and thrive, it must first fall to the ground, be buried and die. Like a grain of wheat, we are called to surrender ourselves to God, and to let go of our own desires, ambitions and attachments. In a world that incentivizes self-interest and personal gain, it is through this act of letting go that we can bear fruit in abundance.

But what does this even mean? As a student at UGA, I always feel like I have to be onto the next big thing: the most involvement, the best internship, the biggest network, the highest paying career. That's what I'm "supposed to do," and it's all a bit overwhelming to think about when considering the act of letting go. Especially during Lent, there is an increased emphasis on fasting from the luxuries of the world.

I don't think there's necessarily a threshold that constitutes being too "worldly" versus being the right amount of "worldly." Though, I do think it's sometimes important to let go of worldly and material desires, so we can truly offer ourselves to God. After all, wealth and possessions are only temporary. So let us walk through life with faith and courage, knowing that in the end, we can only find true and everlasting life in Him.
