A Message from Fr. Michael

Dear Catholic Center Community,

Every valley shall be filled in, every mountain shall be made low. -lsaiah 40

Ups and downs - these might be the only consistency in life: that some moments there are highs and some moments lows, and tepidity in between each. This consistency, the familiarity of the oscillation no matter the goal of life. So, especially a person who wants to live the Christian life well, the oscillation on the journey of life can be nauseating.

And we're given promises:

her guilt is expiated ... every valley shall be filled in ... every mountain shall be made low ... the Lord Himself will give benefits ... new heavens and a new earth.

The promises of God give rise to the heart, and our own skepticism and resistance makes it lie back down. Ups and downs. Yet, all of this is contextualized: The Lord does not delay His promise - as some regard it a "delay."

The model of Mary's Immaculate Conception, celebrated Dec 8 provides for us a way to hold this tension of ups and downs, valleys and mountains - well. At the very first moment of life, Mary is preserved from Original Sin - a unique and exceptional privilege only she enjoys. Yet, this is only the first moment of her life, and the singular event of the Immaculate Conception is in and of itself a promise: God says to her that she won't just be saved in one moment, she'll be saved in all moments - immaculately sustained.

Here, I'm invited to allow God's promise - no matter the high nor the low - to be the consistency in my life: this promise that will level the highway to His Heart. The promise, like Mary, He's made at the beginning of life, sustaining it through, and bringing it to fulfillment.
