Dear Catholic Center Community,

Advent greetings and happy Gaudete Sunday! Gaudete is the Latin word for rejoice! At this point of the Advent season, Christmas is only a short week away, and is full of joyful anticipation. You may have noticed the priest donned rose vestments today- the only day of the liturgical year he wears this color except for Laetare Sunday in Lent. Rose is a melding of the liturgical colors of white and purple that is emblematic of our Christian joy. Purple represents penance and preparation, while white symbolizes purity, joy, light and glory.

Liturgical seasons of preparation such as Advent as Lent remind us that we are always preparing to meet Christ, here in the Eucharist and hopefully for all eternity. Next month, those who desire to enter the Catholic Church through baptism, confirmation, and/or Holy Eucharist, will take the next step in their preparation for reception of the sacraments in the Rite of Acceptance (for unbaptized candidates) and the Rite of Welcome (for baptized candidates both Catholic and non-Catholic). As a Catholic community, let us lovingly embrace in prayer and support all of those who will make this next step of discernment next month on January 14 with the community at the 10:30 am mass.

In this last week before Christmas, let us give thanks that God has sent His son as one of us to save us, and may we not forget that he will come again on a day we cannot predict. In the meantime, let us be always watchful for that day, and joyful as we wait.

"Rejoice always. Pray without ceasing. In all circumstances give thanks, for this is the will of God for you in Christ Jesus."
