# A Message from Anne Frain

### Dear Catholic Center Community,

In today's liturgy, our Lord takes many names. The Holy and Righteous One, the Author of life, Advocate, Father, Jesus Christ, expiation for our sins. So many names and we know there are so many more. The great Provider, Counselor, friend, the Lamb of God, Yeshua. The Lord so beautifully encompasses all and is in all. As I reflect on my past 4 years here at the University of Georgia and prepare to move on from college life, I reflect on who the Father has been to me all 4 years. Freshman year, as I started a new chapter in my life I found so much comfort from Jesus as a friend. Learning how to navigate life in a new place surrounded by new people I had the opportunity to start over and decide who I wanted to be. How scary is that?! I so badly needed a friend who would accompany me through some hard decisions and sacrifices. I found Jesus as a friend in the Eucharist, in isolation and in the friends that surrounded me. When I think of who our Creator is to me, I immediately reflect on who I am to Him: His perfect creation. Made to be adored, made to be loved, made to reflect the beauty of the Creator. From merely witnessing others embracing the Father in the Eucharist, engaging in brief conversations or receiving a friendly smile: I have been blessed and loved by everyone in this community.
