A Message from Sr. Uyen-Chi

Dear Catholic Center Community,

Happy Divine Mercy Sunday! The Octave of Easter ends on the Second Sunday of Easter, that is, the Sunday of Divine Mercy. In the Jubilee Year 2000, at the Mass in which Pope Saint John Paul II canonized Saint Faustina Kowalska, he declared that from then on, throughout the Church, the Second Sunday of Easter would also be called the Sunday of Divine Mercy. This is entirely appropriate since Divine Mercy is "the Easter gift that the Church receives from the risen Christ and offers to humanity." God's love was revealed and actualized as mercy. We see this in the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. The Latin word, which is the ultimate root of our English word "mercy," is misericordia. It derives from two words: misereri, meaning "to have pity on" or "compassion for" and cor, meaning "heart". God's heart was moved with compassion for us sinners, so He sent His Only Son into the world so that we might be saved and have life in abundance.

Last week, during the Triduum, we celebrated how Jesus knelt down to where we sinners are and washed our feet. He was not afraid to get himself dirty in order to make us clean. On Good Friday, Jesus compassionately took on our individual crosses – all that weigh us down – and he helped us carry them, so that we would know that we are never alone in our suffering. Then Jesus died a tortuous death, so that we would experience how much God loves us, that is, "He loves us until the end", until his last breath, and until the last drop of his blood.

In today's gospel we see how Jesus comes to the Apostle, Thomas, with mercy. The Risen Lord comes to him in his doubting state and gives him what he asked for. The Risen Jesus showed Thomas his hands and his side. He showed him his wounds. These wounds reveal to Thomas and to us that Jesus in his divine mercy has united the wounds of humanity forever with his divine nature. We can be confident in God's mercy because, as stated in Hebrews, "For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who has similarly been tested in every way, yet without sin. So let us confidently approach the throne of grace to receive mercy and to find grace for timely help."

As we celebrate this Sunday of Divine Mercy, let us "give thanks to the Lord for he is good; his mercy endures forever" (Psalm 118:1). And may the Lord help us to spread his mercy and to bear witness to it among all our brothers and sisters!

Rejoice in our Risen Lord!
