A Message from Fr. Micheal

Dear Catholic Center Community

Then, Jesus approached them. - Matthew 28

There are many ways to learn and to deepen my understanding of who I am. I could observe how others see me, what they say about me, what they believe about me - and I would learn something about myself. I could look in the mirror, record myself speaking, introspect to the greatest depth - and I would learn something about myself.

However, an important consideration would be the question, "How do I know what I am learning about myself is true?" When others tell me about myself, are they telling the truth or do they observe without bias? When I introspect and observe myself, do I see correctly or do I even have blind spots? Where am I truly known and understood?

Today, the first Sunday after Pentecost, the Church celebrates "Trinity Sunday." Here, we contemplate the most essential and fundamental dogma - more important than Easter, Pentecost, the Bible, the Eucharist, Jesus as perfect God and man, Mariology, etc. After all, the only reason we have those dogmas is because of the Trinity. The only reason, for example, God would give us the Sacrament of Communion is because that Sacrament harmoniously mirrors the Communion of Persons the Trinity is: One God, Three Persons: we receive the Body of Christ and become one body.

In the Trinity, there are no mirrors, nor hearsay. There is only pure relationship: a transparent and unbreakable bond between Persons. The relationship they share doesn't just teach them about who they are to each other, it gives them their very identity: the Father as Father because there's the Son, the Son as Son because there's the Father, and the Holy Spirit as the Bond between them.

Jesus approaches us and reveals to us the mystery: God is a Communion of Persons. When Jesus ascends with His humanity into heaven and from heaven sends the Holy Spirit - God includes us in this Communion.
