Who do people say that I am? - Mark 8

There's a common experience that can sometimes go unnoticed in life: someone can communicate to me who I am. A kind cashier can communicate to me that I am a person. A friend can communicate to me that I am a good friend. A family member can communicate to me that I am lovable. People can communicate to me who I am. The trouble, however, might be that sometimes people might miscommunicate to me who I am. The impatient driver who honks at me might communicate to me that I am "too slow". A frustrated co-worker might communicate to me that life is competitive, "dogeat-dog". Or even I might communicate to myself who I am. It is in this spot that we're invited to have a sense of reverence for our lives. How do we know what is correct: what if it is the case that people have correctly or incorrectly communicated to me who I am?

In today's Gospel, Jesus asks His disciples who people say that He is - and it's pretty clear: most people don't know who Jesus is. Furthermore, He turns to His disciples and asks them who they think He is. And superficially, they get it correct: "Jesus, You are God"; however, they have their preconceived notion about what God can and can't do. Jesus gives them a prophecy about what He is to undergo - "suffer greatly, ... be rejected, ... be killed, ... and Rise" - and Peter speaks up and begins to tell Jesus that Jesus can't do that (presumably the first three in that list), Peter rebukes Jesus.

However, Jesus then rebukes Peter (... like any good friendship). The Greek word here for 'rebuke' essentially means to re-value, or to re-esteem. Jesus claims to be God, and Peter knows Jesus is God - but between them there's two very different values placed on what God can and can't do. So, Jesus will communicate to them the truth of who He is. And it's on the Cross, that Jesus communicates to us all who He is: the One who remains faithful to the ones He loves. Here is the place and the process of verifying who anyone is.

Because at the exact same time in that same spot on the Cross, Jesus communicates to us, who we are: the ones He loves, the ones He is faithful to as He takes up His Cross. The more we look into the Face of God, the more we come to the truth about who we are. And here is where the invitation deepens: in the second reading from James, he says, "Faith without works is dead." Meaning, that if faith is alive, there will be good fruit borne in my life; conversely, if there isn't good fruit being borne in my life, then rather than a condemnation, it becomes an invitation to consider if two question line up and correspond with each other: "who do I say Jesus is?" and "who does Jesus say Jesus is?" The more both these answers are the same, the more there is faith in my life.

Jesus provokes a set of considerations for our own reflection: "Who do I say that Jesus is?" "Who does Jesus say He is?" "Who does Jesus say I am?" "Who have others said I am?" "Who do I say others are?" And each of these are verified by the truth of love seen by our Savior on the Cross.
