A Message from Sr. Uyen-Chi

Dear Catholic Center Community,

Happy 25th Sunday in Ordinary Time! Today's reading from the Gospel of Mark recounted how the disciples were arguing over which of them was the greatest. Jesus admonished them and insisted, "If anyone wishes to be first, he shall be the last of all and the servant of all." In God's view, human greatness is measured by how one serves and helps someone who cannot offer anything in exchange. Jesus's teaching ran counter to what the disciples and most of us think. Even though the Catholic Center sits on the campus of the University of Georgia, Jesus is saying that the value of a person does not depend on the degree we hold or the things we possess. Greatness and success in God's eyes are measured differently: They are measured by service. Not on what someone has, but on what someone gives.

When we think of greatness in service we often think of the saints. Yes, the saints are great. If we close our eyes and think of a few great saints, names like St. Vincent de Paul, Mother Theresa, St. Francis of Assisi will come to mind and the ways they served others. These saints inspire us with their lives of service, and I happily admit that I love reading stories of the saints. What I would also like to add to the list are the "saints" (not yet canonized) that we know in our daily life. From God's point of view, they are great because they serve those in their lives with much love and dedication. I am often moved and touched by the stories that I hear from members of the Catholic Center, who live their simple lives, serving their loved ones in such a beautiful and quiet way. There are young parents who nurture their small children with so much love, tenderness, and patience. There are older parents who are caring for their adult children diagnosed with a terminal illness or serving their loved ones with a disability or helping those family members who are fighting an addiction. And then, there are those who are sandwiched between their elderly parents who need them for their daily needs and their own children who still need them for financial and mental support. For me, these ordinary people exemplify greatness by their humble and quiet life of service, and are very inspiring to witness.

When Jesus challenged his disciples' understanding of greatness, he offered them and us what is truly great, that is, service. In God's eyes, the service that we are called to give depends on the life and circumstance that we find ourselves. In every generation, God calls and raises up great saints to serve societal needs, and in every family and community, God calls ordinary people to serve those in their immediate circle with the same love and grace as the saints. Let us follow the path that Jesus himself traced out for us, the path of service!

Parking and Transportation Options for the Catholic Center

1. Street Parking

- Free on Weekends: Available on certain streets like Lumpkin Street, approximately 0.2 miles from the Catholic Center.
- Restrictions: Avoid parking in residential areas like Cloverhurst
 Apartments—these are strictly for residents. Always check signage to avoid being towed.
- Weekday Parking: Street parking is generally unavailable. Opt for parking decks or Park & Ride alternatives instead.

2. Parking Decks

- Carlton Street Parking Deck (UGA E03): Closest parking option, just 0.3
 miles from the Catholic Center, with a 5-7 minute walk.
- *Rates:* Starts at \$1 for the first 30 minutes, up to a maximum of \$10 per day. Payments can be made via kiosks or the ParkMobile app.
- South Campus Parking Lot: Slightly farther at 0.5 miles, a 10-12 minute walk. Similar rates to Carlton Deck.

3. Special Event Parking

- Football Weekends: Parking near campus, including the Catholic Center, becomes extremely restricted, and towing is strictly enforced. It's advisable to use remote parking or ride-sharing options.
- Catholic Center Parking: Limited to registered, active members of the Catholic Center. Parking is prohibited overnight or on game days for students and visitors.

4. Alternative Transportation

- Park & Ride: Free parking lots are located farther from campus, with shuttles taking you to your destination. The East Campus Park & Ride Lot is a convenient choice.
 - · Cost: Free parking, with UGA buses being free for everyone, not just students.
 - Eco-friendly Tip: This is a great option for avoiding traffic, parking congestion, and costs.
 - Bicycle Parking: Plenty of bike racks are available near the Catholic Center and throughout campus. This is a healthy, cost-free option that eliminates parking hassles altogether.
- Carpooling: Reduce the number of vehicles by carpooling, especially for events or Mass. Parking decks like Carlton Street are great for group parking.
- Pro Tip: Carpooling is not only practical, but it makes attending events more social and fun.
- Ride-sharing (Uber/Lyft): Ideal for those in a hurry or seeking to avoid parking issues altogether. Simply get dropped off at the Catholic Center.
 - · Cost: Fares vary but can be affordable when split with others. A convenient option for short visits or crowded times.
- Remote Parking + Walking Trail: Park farther away and enjoy a scenic walk through local parks or trails to the Catholic Center. This provides a peaceful experience while avoiding the headache of finding parking close to campus.

Our Strategy:

- Eco-friendly: Opt for Park & Ride or Bicycle Parking for stress-free and cost-effective choices.
- Convenience: Use ride-sharing or carpooling to skip the hassle of finding parking altogether.
 - Creative Thinking: Explore remote parking with a scenic walk for a peaceful start to your visit.
