A Message from Fr. Brian

Friends, let us pick up our "Movements at Mass" series, exploring the next five movements of the mass:

The Sign of Peace

The Sign of Peace is a gesture of reconciliation and unity among the faithful. At this moment, we extend peace to those around us, acknowledging our bond as members of Christ's body. This gesture reminds us of Jesus' call to love one another and forgive, fostering a spirit of communion before we approach the Eucharist. It's a moment to release any division and embrace one another in peace, as a visible sign of the harmony that the Eucharist brings.

The Lamb of God

The "Lamb of God" is sung or recited as we prepare for Communion. The words "Lamb of God, who takes away the sins of the world" echo John the Baptist's proclamation about Jesus, the true sacrificial Lamb. In this prayer, we ask for mercy and peace, mindful of Christ's sacrifice for our redemption. It's a profound reflection on the mystery of Christ's love, which brings forgiveness and wholeness, preparing our hearts to receive Him.

Communion

Communion is the pinnacle of our participation in the Mass. As we receive the Body and Blood of Christ, we are united intimately with Him, drawing strength and grace to live as His followers. This act of receiving Communion is both a personal and communal experience, reminding us of our connection with Christ and the Church. Through this sacrament, we are nourished, transformed, and empowered to embody Christ's love in the world.

Prayer after Communion

Following Communion, the priest leads a prayer of thanksgiving, asking that the grace we've received will strengthen and guide us. This prayer helps us reflect on the gift of the Eucharist, inviting us to carry Christ's presence into our daily lives. It's a quiet moment to rest in the mystery of the sacrament, allowing God's love to fill and transform us as we prepare to return to the world.

The Final Blessing and Dismissal

The Mass concludes with the priest's final blessing and dismissal. The priest's blessing sends us forth, encouraged and empowered to live as witnesses of Christ's love. With the words "Go in peace," we are reminded that our mission is just beginning as we bring the light of Christ into every aspect of our lives. The Mass ends, but our calling to live in faith continues, bearing witness to God's love in the world.

Let's hold each other in prayer as we live out this week!
