"I need to be baptized by you, and yet you are coming to me?" (Matthew 3:14). He recognized the holiness of Christ and the radical nature of what was unfolding. Yet Jesus insisted: "Allow it now, for thus it is fitting for us to fulfill all righteousness" (Matthew 3:15). This was more than a baptism it was a moment of divine transition. John's role as forerunner was complete; the Messiah had arrived. John's humility and obedience remind us that our mission is not to seek our own glory, but to lead others to
