"Depart from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man." -Peter

"Do not be afraid." -Jesus - Luke 5

In every story I read about Peter ... I can't help but see myself - not necessarily "for better" but most likely for worse. In today's Gospel, Peter has been fishing all night and has caught nothing; it turns out that I'm not the only one. At some point Peter walks on water [Mt14] (I can't resonate with that ... yet, lol), but I can certainly resonate with sinking in it, figuratively. Peter is handed the keys of the Church [Mt16] (hopefully I never resonate with that, lol), but I can resonate with bossing Jesus around. Peter denies Jesus [Jn18]; I can resonate with that. Then Peter is invited to have an awkward conversation with Jesus after [Jn21], which I can resonate with as well.

Peter's story is relatable, and here I find I'm not the only one who has struggled in his walk with Jesus, and that can be a bit consoling. But while this gives me company, it doesn't actually solve the issue at hand: something really does need to change in my heart. There's something about my pattern of fishing and catching nothing that God desires something different in my life.

So maybe it's a Wednesday, maybe it's a Thursday, but at some point Jesus enters into my life in order for it to never be the same. But the manner in which He enters changes everything. CS Lewis says, "Friendship is born at the moment when one man says to another, 'what? you too? I thought I was the only one." Luke 5, when Jesus gets into Peter's boat is a story of friendship.

Peter is searching desperately for fish, Jesus is searching desperately for Peter. And when they meet and Jesus reveals how committed He is to Peter, Peter realizes that he's actually been searching for Jesus but exclaims, "Depart from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man." And the friendship is verified every single time Jesus does *not* depart from Peter: when Peter is a sinful man, when he's a sinking man, when he's a bossy man, when he's a denying man - in all these things Jesus proves His Love for Peter. And by the end of Peter's life, comes to an undeniable conclusion that they are friends. The invitation is the same for us: simply to be aware how Jesus has not departed for a single moment from us.
