As I pondered a topic, I kept returning to a common theme: our community. My time before UGA was spent at Saint Leo University, where I was involved with the Benedictine Monks Abbey. During spring break, I was fortunate to attend an alumni weekend with fellow students, alumni, and honored guests for Ash Wednesday and the First Sunday of Lent, which made me long for the Catholic Center. The Abbey Church features a vast, vaulted ceiling with a three-tiered altar displaying a large depiction of Christ against a blue and white tiled backdrop and stained-glass windows. I cherished the memories I once held dear, but I felt alone in those recollections, which made me yearn for the Catholic Center.

Our memory as Catholics is more important than we realize, especially during Lent. While I spent much of my time working in the office, worrying about our future, understanding our history has taught me so much. The need to find our purpose—whether as a doctor, lawyer, or PhD in statistics—means we all have a unique calling to excel in our respective fields. This signifies that the light we each carry as Catholics allows us to stand out in the world.

A message I've heard before describes a book author writing in front of a window during a rainstorm. During this time, the writer notices the green and gray colors of the leaves, the grass, and the roads, which all seem to have a different gray-like color. But with the sun reappearing, a new depth of green replaces what was dirt or dust from a different day. The things that make us as Catholics muddy can be washed clean through the season of Lent, and we can find a renewed sense of purpose. "Always begin again, let us rise, then at last for the scripture to steer us, for now the hour is to arise from sleep." - Saint Benedict. I have graciously learned the need to stay active from so many within our small but growing community. From Moms & Tots to Silver Angels, we are a very enriched community, and I greatly appreciate the small moments that have brought me here and now.

In closing, I will leave the scripture note for our Fr. Brian and Fr. Michael, but I am very grateful to everyone for the small acts of kindness that I have witnessed and those that are unnoticed. It is very challenging to build such a giving community, but just as easy to break. Thank you for being a light in the darkness & remember, "Idleness is the enemy of the soul." - Saint Benedict.
