# A Message from Fr. Michael

Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return.

We're already a few days into Lent - how has it been going so far? It already becomes an interesting consideration: what actually makes a good Lent? Come April 20, Easter Sunday, how will I know if Lent was in fact good or not? There can be the measurement of success: how many days out of 40 did I not eat chocolate? How many days out of 40 did I say the daily prayers to which I committed?

But if you could imagine, how far would that measurement get us if we were talking about friendship or marriage? "I emptied the dishwasher 40 days out of 40" might not be the strongest indication of a healthy relationship; the other person might respond, "but you haven't listened to me, but you haven't loved me" - to point out that simply doing things in and of itself isn't the basis of a relationship nor is it the core purpose of Lent.

The irony when it comes to Lent, is that oftentimes it can be seen and approached and practiced as a period of time where I just do or don't do a bunch of things; what Lent is meant to point out is exactly that, to quote *Heart of the World*, "I have murdered no one, robbed no bank, set no houses on fire...nothing incriminating will be produced against me...I've been responsible...washed, cooked, cleaned...I am a practicing Christian... Sundays I've been to church...'I have, I have'...What I have done with my religion is raise up walls against God...if you live near a waterfall for a week, you'll no longer hear its rumble." (pp. 94-96)

What Lent is meant to point out is how often I've lived life on my own reliance. And as it points toward Easter, specifically the Resurrection, it offers humanity the solution that because Jesus Christ has risen from the dead, nothing can actually separate me from Him - showing that life is meant to be lived in a togetherness. So, the repentance Lent proposes is leaving behind a life lived on my own reliance, a life lived alone.

So, what makes a good Lent? Not if I'm successful. But how about if I become a better friend of Jesus, allow Him into my life a bit more, get to know who He actually is, allow Him to help me in the day to day and with my burdens - in a word, fall more in Love with Him.
