# A Message from Fr. Michael

See, I am doing something new. - Is 43

Then Jesus said, "Neither do I condemn you. Go, and from now on do not sin anymore." - Jn 8

I consider everything as a loss because of the supreme good of knowing Jesus Christ my Lord. - Phil 3

The core invitation and consideration of Lent is "who is God?" As I give things up or add things on, the hope is that I see and hear a little bit more and get to know who this God is. When I get to know this God more and more, the things in my life begin to change.

For example, knowing who God is changes dry prayer into communion. We know about this God, that He walks with people in the desert both in Exodus as well as Jesus Himself entering into the desert. When He does, I'm not alone in my wandering nor my thirst. In fact, the reason for what leads Him into the desert is a thirst that He Himself has to find us where we are - here is where dryness turns to communion.

Today's Gospel can be a tough one to receive. There's a person and they're caught in the very act of sin; furthermore, there's about to be punishment for it.

It is so important to know who God is. Today's first reading softens our hearts: "See, I am doing something new." There's a proposal that something will be different. And indeed there is: we want to pay attention to Jesus' response to sin, this is a revelation of who God is. When Jesus is confronted with what to do with the woman, He asks those to consider what should be done to them.

In an instant, everything changes. This might be the first time in her life that a man has looked lovingly upon her. Might be the first time in her life that a man has protected her - Jesus was willing to stand in between her and the stones to be thrown. This teaches her who He is. And the very spot of her demise and shame has become a spot of reconciliation.

She is taught that no sin is too big for God, that no sin is unforgivable; furthermore, she finds that it's only in Him that she finds freedom never to return to darkness when He says to her, "Neither do I condemn you. Go, and sin no more." How has Lent been teaching you about God and about the relationship you share?
