May I never glory except in the Cross of our Lord Jesus Christ - Galatians 6

A couple days ago, in the U.S., we celebrated Independence Day. And it's a time to reflect on "from what" we have declared our independence. But the invitation isn't simply to reflect on "from" but also "for" what we have declared our independence; but even more so, "on what" we are declaring our dependence.

When Ancient Israel is freed from Egypt, that is only one half of the picture. For what they are freed becomes even more important. The image is clear: imagine they are only freed from Egypt, then their wandering around aimlessly in the desert becomes just as enslaving as Egypt. To recognize for what a person is freed becomes the more important consideration. And in this case they are freed for the promised land.

This can be an invitation of awareness in our lives: I can name probably a million things I would like to be free from, but how many can I name that I'd like to be freed for? I want to be free for loving my neighbor, I desire to be free for more peace in my life, etc.

Finally, declaring independence can be an important, necessary, freeing thing to do - but only if it is oriented in a way that will lead to true freedom. If I declare independence for my own sake, then I will inevitably become a tyrant to others seeking only to free myself from the shackles of those around me. Also, if there is nothing upon which I depend, then I will always hold on to myself, and because I cannot give what I do not have I will never be truly free.

The word 'depend' has its etymology from the Latin: de (from) pendere (to hang) - therefore, "to hang from." So the second consideration is, from what have I been hanging recently? We look to the Cross to see how our Savior hung from that tree, it's a true symbol of freedom - that He is able to love, free to love even in life's difficult circumstances. Not hanging from a torture device, but hanging on to the very God for His own dear life. Jesus is free, and teaches us to hang from God, too.
