A Message from Fr. Michael

Blessed indeed will you be because of their inability to repay you. - Lk 14

Jesus is always turning things on their head: "Everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted." "If you wish to save your life you must lose it." But what if He was actually turning things on their proper side? Today, Jesus invites those hosting Him, "Do not invite your friends ... in case they might invite you back and you have repayment."

There can be a tendency in our lives that results in an upward race, a race to the top. When enough people jump into this race it can create a culture. Jesus observes this about us, "... noticing how they were choosing the places of honor at table." If Jesus is returning things to their proper orientation, then the invitation is to race to the bottom symbolic of when He washes His disciples' feet: a race to serve another.

When Jesus invites His disciples to purposefully choose the lowest places, He's not asking them to indulge in self-pity nor self-abnegation; He's proposing that the place of honor is to serve another: "It is an honor to serve you." And more than that, intensifies the honor when the people we serve cannot pay us back. The word we're revolving around here is 'freedom.'

To be free from expecting something in return literally frees me to serve another. The beautiful thing about the way Jesus does things is that, much like asking His disciples to wash others' feet, He will not ask us to do something He Himself won't do - and so He humbles Himself and washes their feet to serve as an example.

The revelation of Jesus' Love deepens however: if Jesus is asking us to love without expecting anything in return, then this becomes a revelation of the Cross. Jesus Loves us not expecting anything in return - He is free to Love. The invitation is to allow that to sink in to our own hearts: Jesus is free, He Loves us, and doesn't expect anything in return, "Blessed indeed will you be because of their inability to repay you."

What Jesus is inviting all of us to is freedom, to make an authentic gift of our lives, and unconditionally - whether a person can repay me or not, to have no distinction between loving someone who can or can't. So, we're invited to look at our own poverty we try to compensate for through places of honor, our own inability to repay Him; then to look at Him humbling Himself and Loving us anyways.
