# A Message from Jenni

Whenever my turn to write the bulletin note comes around, I usually try to convince someone else to write an inciteful, spiritual, beautiful note. When that quest fails and after many hours of procrastination I go to the topic I know the best..."Life at the Catholic Center." After over 11 years at the CC, I have worked with 8 priests, 5 nuns, and countless staff members. I am so very blessed to be a witness to all that goes on here.

As I was pondering what to write, I was thinking of my favorite day of the week at the Catholic Center (other than Sunday, of course). This would be Wednesdays. Wednesday encapsulates all that makes the Catholic Center unique and wonderful. The people participating in events and activities on Wednesdays range from a few months old to college students to retirees. The opportunity to share our faith and fellowship is invaluable and is a gift to all who come through the doors.

Wednesday morning begins with Adoration at 9AM in the Chapel. Students, priests and community members gather to "visit with Jesus". This is a beautiful way to start the day. Tot Time, which is an opportunity for parents/caregivers and their tots to come together for play and fellowship meets at 10AM. The sound of toddlers playing is music to our ears. At that same time, our Focus Missionaries are having coffee and fellowship with Fr. Brian and Fr. Michael.

As the day goes on, the collegiates begin to trickle in. At any given time, there will be a handful of students gathered in the library or the hall to study, cram for an exam coming up in the next hour or make plans for the day. Without fail, approximately 95% of the students walking in the door stop at the Student Pantry for a quick snack or possibly the only meal of the day. (Editor's note: thank you to everyone who continues to keep our Student Pantry stocked).

Reconciliation begins at 4PM and resident members and students prayerfully wait their turn. Our Daily Mass at 5:30PM is also filled with students and resident members. I often see friendships develop between the resident members and the students as they gather before and after Mass.

Throughout the afternoon, you will see Lynn Renna, our director of Religious Education and a few of her catechists placing traffic cones out in the parking lot. They are preparing for Religious Education at 6:15PM when 137 students and 43 catechists gather to learn about our Catholic faith.

As Lynn and the catechists shepherd the children to their awaiting parents, Darby Crawford, our kitchen manager is hard at work in the kitchen preparing a meal for the last event of the day, Ignite, our freshmen ministry. 85 freshmen and Ignite team members gather at 8PM every Wednesday for a meal, a speaker and small group discussion. The opportunity to share the highs and lows of the first year of college as well as share our faith is a gift.

Throughout all of the days at the Catholic Center, not just Wednesday, there is love, faith, joy and sharing.
