### A Message from Fr. Michael

*"They opened their treasures and offered Him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh." -Mt 2*

"God became human, so that humans can become god," this is a statement from the early Church. Upon initial glance it can seem uncomfortable, even heretical. But upon deeper examination, it reveals God's desire and intent. When a young man humbles himself, gets down on one knee, and proposes to the love of his life, he makes his intentions known. When God humbles Himself, takes on human flesh, He is making His intentions known.

It is not simply the rest of your life that God wants to spend with you: it is for all of eternity that He wants to be with you. This is why the early Church stating that humanity becomes eternal is so crucial for our lives here on earth: if we can view our lives in the analogy of an engagement and heaven is the everlasting marriage, then preparation becomes important.

There are a few ways to think about this. First, if God wants to spend an eternity with me, then I cannot simply love conditionally or for a temporary amount of time; something has to change within me so I can love God for all eternity. Another consideration, if God wants to spend an eternity with me, then I can't just pay attention to Him for a few minutes; something has to change within me so I can focus on God for all eternity. So, what we become aware of is that something must transform within me for me to love longer than I can now. Here is how this happens.

In today's celebration of Epiphany, there are three kings who receive in prayer the prophecy that the King of kings has been born. It is obvious to them: they are invited to bring Him gifts. Here is where our reflection begins: what if you were the fourth, what would you bring to Jesus?

As this unfolds it becomes important to anticipate His gratitude for whatever you desire to bring. In being aware of God's gratitude for desiring to spend more time with Him this year, don't be surprised if your heart becomes full from His gratitude for what you have given. Now we can begin to see how we are made eternal: our attention and our love.

The invitation from today's celebration is to consider that the only fulfilling way to live is to completely offer oneself to God. This is founded upon the fact that in His nativity, He has completely given Himself to us first. And it is upon that foundation that humanity finds the trust to offer themselves back to the Creator: placed into His hands, is how we become eternal.
