A Message from Dorothy Ratcliff

Dear Catholic Center members,

If I have not gotten the chance to see you in person yet, happy new year! School started this past Monday for us UGA students and I am happy to be back.

This week is the second Sunday in Ordinary Time but the Baptism of the Lord takes over the first Sunday in Ordinary Time so really today feels like the first Sunday in Ordinary Time.

Last week my roommates and I took down all of our Christmas decor, our outdoor lights, advent candles, blowups, etc. I jokingly referred to this as us "decorating our house for Ordinary Time." In the following days the Church also began taking down the Christmas decor, stripping away the purple linens and Christmas trees for green linens and ferns. Everyone started going back to their "normal". But there is nothing "normal" or "ordinary" about our faith as Catholics, rather quite the opposite.

Each and everyday across the entire world there are millions of people who are praying in front of the very real and physical Jesus Christ. This is something that no other denomination of faith even has. Many of us have been Catholic for years, I myself was born Catholic. The consecration of Christ is not a foreign or new concept to me. In this normalcy and regularity of being exposed to the real life Christ day in and day out I have at certain points lost the miracle and wonder that is Christ in the Eucharist. It has simply become a normal expectation that I receive. But it should not be this way.

As Catholics we get the opportunity to become so very close to the same Man that created the entire universe. This Sunday (or Saturday for the vigil members) as you go up to receive communion, remind yourself that you are not just eating a random bland cracker, but rather the Son of God, creator of the World, Jesus Christ.

We have daily Mass Monday through Thursday at 5:30PM and at 8AM on Friday. This celebration of our Creator is not limited to just Sundays rather every day of the week we are able to partake in this intimate connection with Christ. I go to daily Mass most days of the week, so if you see a girl in the back few pews with red hair chances are it is me. Know that if you see me I am praying for you.
