### A Message from Fr. Michael

"The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light." -Is 8  
"Come after Me, and I will make you fishers of men." -Mt 4  
"So that the cross of Christ might not be emptied of its meaning." -1 Cor 1

Today Jesus is starting a new business. He encounters Peter, Andrew, James, and John - all who are fishermen, making a business by catching fish. The intersection now comes between the life that these men live and Jesus. In today's first reading, there is a prophecy given by God to Isaiah that the two tribes of Israel that were destroyed first, around 700BC, will actually be the first to receive light. The fulfillment of Isaiah's prophecy is when Jesus invites these men into a new business, in the exact same place where the decimation happened comes a new beginning. Will this be a new fishing business? Kind of. Will this be a new light business? Kind of.

The fact that Jesus enters right into that region to restore that region is the understanding of what sort of business Jesus is up to. Jesus lives with an ache in His Heart for More: so, the way this plays out is that when Jesus sees these men fishing, He wants them to receive more. If you go to Luke 5, it gives more particular details of Peter's own decimation in his life: not able to catch a single fish. Jesus meets Peter right there and restores Him with a miracle catch of fish. Jesus is basically saying, "your life is decent right now, but how about better?" not to serve as a hypothetical but as a sincere and real invitation.

More particularly, when Jesus enters into a person's life, I can't help but ponder that when Jesus asks someone to follow Him, He knows what He is asking people to give up. Today He looks at these four men, knows full well that they will give up nets, boats, and family for the sake of Jesus. But it doesn't end there: three of the four will give up their lives as martyrs to follow Jesus, and John will be sent into exile. Jesus knows the cost each of these men will pay to follow Him.

So, what sort of business this will be will hinge on what Jesus will give: His own Life. The fishermen did not know about Jesus' mission to enter into all human darkness, decimation, and disfunction called the Cross. However, they must have seen something in His Eyes: He would not ask something of them that He Himself is not willing to do. It is only from this spot that Jesus' new business will make any sense: He is in the business of giving to the people He Loves -- everything. All He is asking in return is everything. It is only in seeing the sincerity in His Eyes that allows a person to live joyfully and purposefully in this new Covenant He has given.
